



<b>Lesson:</b> Exploring a World of Opportunity – Using Your Gifts in Employment	2024-25 Academic Year
<b>Overview:</b> Students will experience four primary career clusters through in-classroom discussion, face-to-face expo interaction, and hands-on demonstrations by regional employers.	
<b>Essential Question(s):</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. How can a first impression impact my future?</li><li>2. What careers best utilize my strengths and interests?</li><li>3. What is the purpose of Worlds of Opportunity Expo?</li><li>4. What careers are available in Lynchburg Region in the areas Transportation, Energy/Utilities, Public Safety, Construction, Agriculture, Manufacturing, Automotive/Logistics, Engineering/Environment, Financial/ Financial Services, Retail/Customer Service, Hospitality/Tourism, Marketing/Communications, Healthcare/Medical, and Technology</li></ol>	
<b>Objective(s):</b> Students will: <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Explore strengths and interests related to careers in the area.</li><li>2. Identify high-demand occupations in the greater Lynchburg region.</li><li>3. State the relationship between math, science, communications, and interpersonal skills with success in various occupations.</li><li>4. Create a 4-Year Plan based on a career interest inventory, Expo experiences, and class discussion.</li></ol>

## **Procedures/Activities:**

1. Teacher Preparation:
  - Review materials and prepare opening discussion about the importance of planning and the power of a first impression
  - Review and Edit PowerPoint slides for your school.
  - Instruct students how to greet professionals by making eye contact, shaking hands, and giving an appropriate greeting.
  - Students will practice in small groups then rotate.
  - Students will discuss the importance of networking
2. Worlds of Opportunity Trip: Build excitement among your students by sharing the WOO Career Close Up Videos on the WOO website, and reviewing the Career Guide by completing the provided scavenger hunt quiz.
3. Discuss logistics, dress code, and expectations for Worlds of Opportunity Expo trip. See teacher packet for details regarding trip. Review agenda and requirements with your students. Stress to students they must use time wisely and go to the vendors in each worlds that interest them the most in the zone. There may not be enough time to experience every exhibit. Students should **not** bring books, phones, or backpacks to the expo.
4. Post-Worlds of Opportunity Class Discussion: Students should identify their top experiences at WOO and discuss the value of networking.
5. Post-Worlds of Opportunity Career Survey: Complete Survey following WOO event by October 18<sup>th</sup>, 2024
6. Post-Worlds of Opportunity Activity: Students should record a brief summary of the WOO experience (What did they enjoy the most? What Worlds did not appeal to them? What do they want to remember two years from now about the experience?). Additional activities/projects can include creating a PowerPoint presentation, writing an essay, or creating a poster.
7. Post-Worlds of Opportunity Communications/Networking: As a class, in groups, or individually, have students select one WOO exhibitor to thank and connect. Optional activity: write and mail letters or thank you cards to chosen exhibitors.
